

## GREEK REFRESHER COURSE



Pittsburgh Theological Seminary will offer the course "Polishing Your New Testament Greek"

throughout the academic year. The Rev. Dr. James A. Durlesser, lecturer in biblical languages at PTS and retired United Methodist pastor, will lead the course.

Area clergy are invited to refresh their Greek by reading together selections from the New Testament and reviewing essential points of grammar. There will be an opportunity to examine modern translations with an eye to the question of why scholars have made the choices they have in rendering the New Testament into English. Participants can expect that their sermons, teaching, and general theological understanding will all gain from their experience in this study group.

Classes run Wednesdays from 12:30-2:00 p.m. Sept. 26 - Oct. 31 (Term I); Jan. 9, 16, 23, Feb. 6 and 20, 2013 (Term II); and April 3 - May 8, 2013 (Term III). The course will cover Advent Gospel Lectionary Readings during Term I, Lenten Gospel Lectionary Readings in Term II, and Excerpts from the Acts of the Apostles during Term III.
