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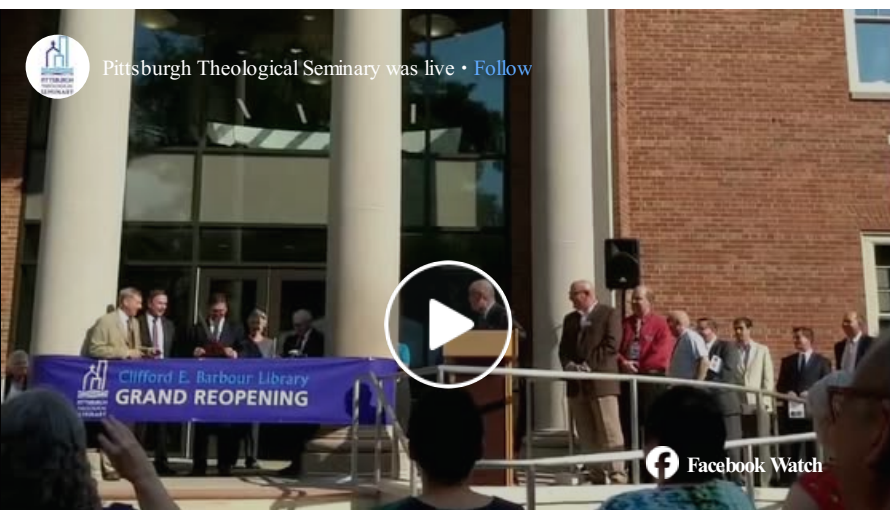

Highlights of the new space include:

Fred Rogers Family Room, a study space for students with children

Rossin Writing Lab, where students meet for tutoring and writing assistance from the director of the Center for Writing and Learning Support

Integrative Learning Space, a creative room bringing together art and ministry

Active Learning Space, which allows users to stay physically fit while studying

This project addressed the full range of renovation needs to establish creative spaces that inspire people to engage with theological ideas and each other in community and collaboration; to incorporate innovation that supports theological reflection, inquiry, and research; and to preserve our collection purposefully. In addition to the highlighted spaces mentioned above, the library includes:

Group-study rooms accommodating 6-8 people

Updated shelving for the library collections

An atrium and skylight for natural lighting

A 24/7 area for after-hours study

Updated HVAC and fire suppressant systems

A café with healthy food choices

A media room where students can record themselves delivering sermons

Updated elevator

A new reference room for quiet study

An updated classroom

Updated technology and wireless access

A more open floorplan with several different study and lounge areas.

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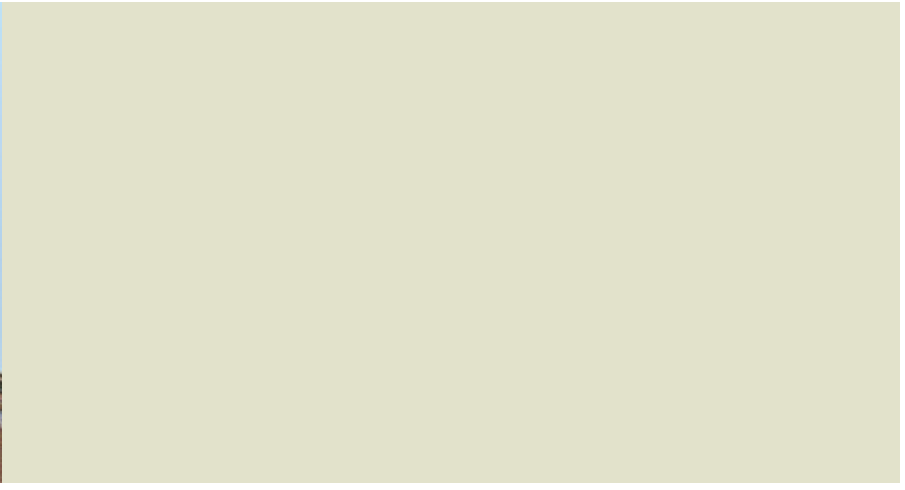
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
