
ACADEMICALLY RIGOROUS AND ROOTED IN THE REFORMED TRADITION

With a focus on practical ministry training and a commitment to serving diverse populations, our seminary master's programs provide transformative educational experiences. We foster an environment that celebrates shared prayer and worship, intellectual inquiry, civil discourse, theological reflection, witness, reconciliation, justice, evangelism, and service.

Through these values, our seminary master's programs prepare our graduates with advanced practical skills for their vocation underscored with a commitment to formation and doing God's work in the world.

MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAMS



MASTER OF DIVINITY (M.DIV)

The master of divinity degree program prepares students to begin their vocations as ordained ministers or pastoral leaders across a wide range of settings. It can be completed on either a full- or part-time basis with hybrid courses that meet online each week and in person twice per semester.

Our M.Div. program allows students to specialize in their area of interest through an individualized course of study, as well as options for a joint degree pathway with another professional field including social work or law. The curriculum focuses on deep theological reflection through a contextual lens and is paired with a Field Education component for the development of ministry skills.


MASTER OF THEOLOGICAL STUDIES (M.T.S.)

The master of theological studies degree program features a highly customizable curriculum for students to tailor their education to their goals—whether that be continuing in another graduate program, pursuing a Christian education career, or enhancing their personal spiritual development.

The rigorous M.T.S. curriculum culminates in a final project that explores the student's area of interest, which can range from the Old Testament to practical theology to Christian leadership and beyond. What's more, students can engage in research courses or accent their degree with a Graduate Certificate in Urban Ministry.

We offer our master's programs and certificates in a hybrid format, consisting of weekly online courses and limited inperson gatherings on campus in Pittsburgh each semester. This allows our students to flexibly pursue a rewarding master's seminary program that seamlessly fits into their myriad of personal and professional responsibilities. Because our degree and certificate programs are offered in a hybrid format, classes can be taken in-person, hybrid, or online. The schedule is planned years in advance, so students can elect which delivery format best fits their needs. Students who prefer in-person learning and have the schedule flexibility can choose to do so.

Field Education is a key component of the graduate seminary programs at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. It sits at the intersection of theory and practice, providing a welcoming environment for students to develop ministry skills and discern their calling.
