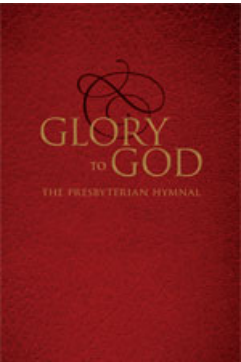


## PTS HOSTS HYMN FESTIVAL AND WORKSHOP



Pittsburgh Theological Seminary will host a workshop and hymn festival Sat., April 20, 2013 beginning at

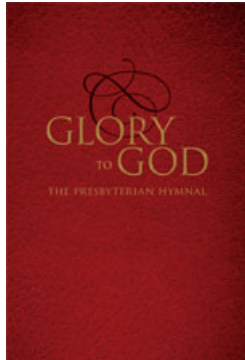
