Simon Peter answered and said, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.' Jesus answered and said to him, 'Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah, for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven'" (Matthew 16:15-17). Mark (9:2-8) and Luke (9:28-36) also record the Transfiguration, and 2 Peter 1:16-18 also recalls the awe-inspiring event.
